HEALTH PROMOTION

Policy

Woodlupine Primary School supports the community by reinforcing and modelling good nutrition and healthy lifestyle choices. This is a whole school approach to the establishment of consistent positive messages through the delivery of curriculum, promoting of waste wise foods and encouragement of physical activity.

Guidelines

The school has a responsibility to ensure these messages are delivered by:

- teaching the importance of positive food and health concepts via the curriculum;
- encouraging healthy foods in lunch boxes;
- developing a consistent schoolwide approach to mental and emotional health;
- reinforcing hygienic practices within and across the school;
- supporting and discussing waste wise foods;
- modelling healthy food and drink choices in the canteen menu, in the staff room, for class treats/rewards; and
- implementing the WA Government's "Traffic Light Healthy Food and Drink Choices" policy;



Our school will build and maintain positive relationships with families and the wider community in respect to key health messages and initiatives and the support of the canteen/canteen promotion of healthy eating. We will include at least one communication per term in the school newsletter outlining healthy lifestyle and eating guidelines and information.

Canteen Guidelines

The canteen menu is reviewed by the Woodlupine Primary School Executive in consultation with the P&C. The P&C will encourage and make available a wide range of foods that should make up the majority of a healthy diet (GREEN).

The canteen will also:

- reduce foods that do not meet specified minimum nutrient criteria (RED);
- comply with the Occupational Safety and Health act 1984 and Regulations;
- display evacuation and other emergency procedures documentation prominently;
- refuse entry to students during cooking/preparation times; and
- report equipment maintenance needs, structural defects or faults management issues to the principal's delegate (Manager Corporate Services)
