Mix them up and show them to your child one at a time quickly. <p>Name practice: In your scrapbook, practice writing the first letter of your name without using your tracing sheet.</p> <p>What letter name and letter sound does your name start with?</p>	<p>Counting: Roll the dice and use your counters to count out the correct number.</p> <p>Don't forget to line up the counters and touch each object as you count it.</p> <p>Repeat this activity six times.</p>	<p>Getting ready for school: Practice packing your lunch box and lunch bag by yourself. You need to open and close all containers by yourself and pack them inside your lunch bag. Don't forget to zip your lunch bag closed.</p>
