

Class Newsletter – Room 9, Year 3 and 4

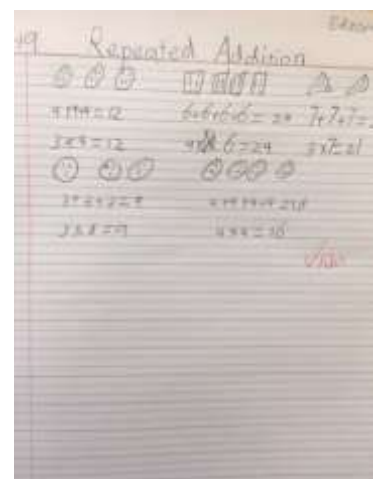
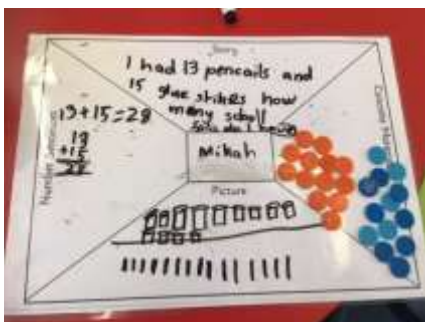
