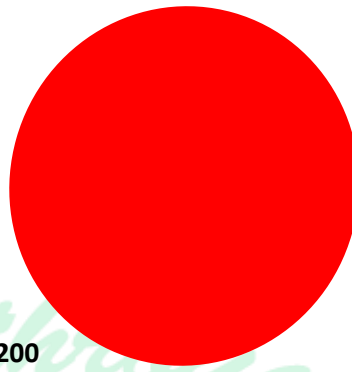

Hello All,

I am a Shebah driver based in Maida Vale. You are fortunate enough to be in a Shebah zone and have a couple of drivers in your community all authorized to carry children unaccompanied. As you might be aware, only Shebah allows unaccompanied minors to travel in our vehicles. Other transport platforms are unable to transport unaccompanied minors and passengers/drivers will have their accounts suspended for transporting any child under 18.

Our drivers can be booked in advance and if car seats or boosters are required, they are installed by an authorized fitter.

Other schools find our transport service reduces congestion around your school, reduces parental anxiety and increases attendance.
